STRANGVAC VACCINE

Strangvac is an intramuscular vaccine against the highly contagious disease strangles. It is indicated that Strangvac reduces clinical signs and the number of abscesses during the acute stage of strangles.

The primary course requires a first vaccine and a second vaccine four weeks later.

For the month of May we are offering the second vaccine FREE OF CHARGE (only the visit charge to be covered by you)

The Grass is getting Greener



Weight Management for your Horses



The rain over the weekend has made the fields greener and the grass grow. At this time of year we need to monitor our horses and ponies' to watch for trends of weight gain, or loss. Overweight equines is a huge problem in the UK and recognising the signs is a vital first step. If we see our horses every day, weight gain or loss can easily be missed.

- Take regular photos of your horse and compare to previous months or years.
- Use a weigh tape, or even just a piece of baler twine, to measure whether your horse is getting larger, or smaller.
- Body condition score your horse.
- Get your horse weighed. Some feed companies will visit your yard and bring scales to weigh your horse.

Monthly measurements (or perhaps every time your farrier visits?) will help you spot trends and prevent disease such as Laminitis, heart and breathing problems or early onset arthritis and lameness.

If you are struggling with managing your horses' weight, please get in touch. We may have some ideas that can help, or we may recommend some blood tests to look for underlying disease. Equine metabolic syndrome (EMS) may require additional medical treatment to help kick start a weight loss campaign. We are having good successes with new medications, which are affordable. Testing for insulin alone can be extremely informative but further blood tests may be applicable to individuals too. Blood tests are very useful for horses that are underweight.

Routine management including regular dentistry, monitoring worm egg counts and tapeworm burdens also help with weight management in horses. Please speak to our vets for further information and advice.
